I left a message with Ziploc marketing about the potential for adding Reynolds users and they sent me a coupon to pick up one of their sealers at no cost. I am very pleased with the Ziploc product, it works even better than the Reynolds bags, with either the Reynolds or Ziploc sealer. I use it for small quantities of frozen food as well as providing for refrigerator items, such as cheese.

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
